The community mural at Farrington High School transforms and beautifies a space on campus by the special needs student classrooms, creating an environment that feels welcoming, vibrant, and cared for. Beyond its visual impact, the project is about building ownership and connection within the community by giving people the opportunity to directly contribute to the artwork.

To make this possible, Jasper Wong, World Wide Walls founder, designed a 71-foot-long mural in the form of a massive paint-by-numbers piece. This approach invites students, families, teachers, and community members to actively participate in bringing the artwork to life. Each brushstroke allows them to leave a personal mark, creating not just a mural, but a shared legacy of creativity, inclusivity, and community pride.
